"Revelation" = "apokalupsis" in Greek (an uncovering, a revealing, a revelation)
It's the only book in the Bible that promises a special
Blessed is he who reads and those who hear the words of this prophecy Revelation 1:3
It's the only book in the Bible that comes with its own
Write the things which you have seen, and the things which are, and the things which will take place after this ("metatauta") Revelation 1:19
The 3 "Acts" in Revelation:
Act 1: "the things which you have seen" // Chapter 1
Act 2: "the things which are" // Chapters 2 & 3 The
Act 3: "the things which will take place after this" ("metatauta") // Chapters 4-22

After these things (metatauta) I looked, and behold, a door standing open in heaven. And the first voice which I heard was like a trumpet speaking with me, saying, "Come up here, and I will show you things which must take place after this (metatauta)." - Revelation 4:1

After Revelation 4:1 the word "" never again appears in the Revelation narrative.
V.1: God this revelation because He wants His servants to know what is going to
"shortly" = "entachos" in Greek (root of English word "tachometer" // acceleration) "But all these things are merely the beginning of birth pangs." - Matthew 24:8 (NASB)
This Revelation will be given in "signified" = "semaino" in Greek (a sign, to give a sign, communicated)
