2 witnesses are required to establish a matter as true under the Law (See Deuteronomy 19:15, Matthew 18:16, & 2 Corinthians 13:1)

V.4 is a reference to Zechariah 4:1-6

And it shall be that whoever will not hear My words, which He speaks in My name, I will require it of him."  - Deuteronomy 18:15 & 18-19
"Behold, I will send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and dreadful day of the Lord." – Malachi 4:5 (Also see 3:1-7)
Elijah didn't – he was (See 2 Kings 2:11)
